## Paul E. Burrington

Joplin Missouri -- Paul E. Burrington, age 66, passed away at his home on Sunday, July 5, 2015, after a courageous eight-year battle with cancer.

He married Patti Campbell on Nov. 23, 1973. She survives at the home.

Additional survivors include one son, Chad Burrington and his wife, Courtney; one amazing grandson, Ryan, who was a blessing to his Pop and brought more joy to him than he will ever know. Also surviving is a brother, John Burrington Jr.; sister-in-law, Sherri Orender and her husband, Darrell, Webb City; and many nieces and nephews, which he loved like they were his own. In addition to his parents, Paul was preceded in death by a sister, Carol Burrington Anderson.
